Bobby, Vince, Brian and Curtis looked great in their tuxedos and sounded terrific. This was to be Ben's last time to see the guys. He passed away Feb. 27, 2004, at 66 yrs. old. As a lasting tribute to him, I played all the Freshmen CD's at his wake. Just listening to their music made those three hours upbeat and helped me and my family through a tough time.
